...for it means those who cannot appreciate the food that is given to you, cannot appreciate our teaching in its true sense. When you listen to our teaching, you should accept it, but if you have some prejudice, you cannot accept the teaching. For [???] to appreciate teaching in its true sense, means we should not have any discrimination with our food. This is a good test for ourselves. The food you have now will not be complete for you. Something will be quite strange or unfamiliar. We should appreciate the food we have at each meal.
